January's Gospel Readings

The Second Sunday After Christmas (1/3) - St. Matthew 2. 19-23

Joseph is commanded by an angel in his dream to bring Jesus and Mary to the land of Isreal upon the death of King Herod.

The First Sunday after Epiphany (1/10) - St. Matthew 4: 12-22

Jesus Christ starts his ministry upon the imprisonment of St John the Baptist. Christ's mission was to attract people to the "Kingdom of Heaven" through repentance.

The Second Sunday after Epiphany (1/17) - St. John 1:43-51

Jesus searches for faithful disciples who would take over leadership after Christ completes his mission. Christ's response to those who doubted his mission was "Come and See". Jesus is proclaimed as the "Son of God" and "King of Israel".

The Third Sunday after Epiphany (1/24) - St. John 3: 1-12

Through his early ministry, Christ reveals that we must be "born again" to enter the eternal "Kingdom of God". The "new birth" depicts our union with Christ through the water of baptism and receiving the Holy Spirit through chrismation. This "new birth" is necessary to enter the "Kingdom of God".

Remembering the Departed Priests (1/31) - St. Matthew 24: 42:51

Jesus is talking to his disciples and gives them a parable of the returning master. Christ's purpose with this parable is for us to watch, be ready, and vigilant by following his commandments as well as purifying ourselves through repentance in preparation to receive the Lord.
