

June Gospel Readings

June 6: 2nd Sunday After Pentecost (St. Matthew 10:5-16)

Christ sends his disciples on a mission to the Jews to preach and heal. Christ prepares them **EVENING PRAYER:** to be single-minded in their mission. He also reminds them that His power is free; a gift from God. Christ commissions his disciples to give greetings of peace, the same peace that was proclaimed by the prophets, which would be revealed as a fruit of the Holy Spirit. To this day, Christ's peace is offered to the faithful in the liturgy - "Peace be to all".

June 13: 3rd Sunday After Pentecost (St. John 6:35-46)

In this passage, Christ refers to the spiritual needs of the people. It is the spiritual food Jesus is offering instead of physical, which is needed to satisfy our spiritual hunger for eternity. Jesus says the word he speaks of is about the Spirit. It is the Spirit that gives us eternal life, not the flesh. The Eucharist (Holy Qurbana) represents the communion of the believers in His Body and Blood. The Eucharist is the fulfillment of Jesus' sacrifice which is absolutely necessary for salvation.

June 20: 4th Sunday After Pentecost (St. Luke 10-1-16)

The Lord appoints seventy others and sent them two by two into every city and place where He Himself was about to go. The seventy were appointed to call men to Christ; as laborers to represent Jesus in his ministry of preaching and healing as people everywhere were in need of spiritual and physical healing.

June 27: 5th Sunday After Pentecost (St. Luke 9:10-17)

In this passage, Christ first healed and spoke the gospel, and then fed the multitude with miraculous bread by the hands of His disciples. Jesus' blessing and breaking the bread teaches us that we have to give thanks to Him who gives us food and directs us to pursue spiritual food greater than that which is earthly.

June 29: Remembrance of St. Peter & St. Paul - End of Apostles' Fast (St. Matthew 20:1-16)

In this parable, the vineyard is life in this world. The day refers both to the span of a single person's life and to the whole human history. The laborers are all the people in every nation. Each hour can refer to times in a person's life.
